Scales

(1) What is a Scale?

A scale is a series of notes played going up or going down one step at a time until we reach the same note that we started on.

(2) Write the scale degree numbers on the C major scale below, then mark the semitones with slurs.



- Write the key signature
- Mark the semitones with slurs
- Complete the scale with a double barline
